Well God gave us the perseverance to not only climb the mountain, but to make it to the top, so to speak. In March we looked at available homes in the Pembine area. There were really only 2 that were considerations. 1 of those 2 spoke to both of us....." please buy me....." Not really believing it would go anywhere, we pursued some of the first steps in the process. We were pleasantly surprised that we were able to get financing. Then came the inspections of everything. We wanted to know clearly that we wouldn't find any hidden issues down the road. All of those passed as well as the appraisal coming in where we needed it to be. During this time we just sat back and let God be in charge. I, Lisa, would have to say, it was one of the calmer times in my life. You're saying what???? Buying a house, calm???? Well, I learned that when you let God be in COMPLETE control of the situation, He, and only He, is able to MOVE those big mountains. He has just been waiting for me to get out of the way. Our new house is only 3.5 miles from camp. (another one of our desires-to be close) We closed on May 31st and throughout the summer, in the midst of both working full time at camp, we are doing some renovations to make it our new HOME. Our goal is to move in September. We are remodeling the 2 upstairs bedrooms and bathroom into a bedroom, walk in closet/ upstairs laundry, and making a bigger bathroom. Additionally, we are putting in new flooring throughout the upstairs and everything needs to be painted. We also have a few bigger projects that need to be done, but we'll have to do as we have the finances: a new roof (still the original 30 yr. old one), replace the water heater and refrigerator (ours conveniently died and we are using a camp spare), a garage needs to be built, and the deck that is on it needs some TLC. We are excited to make this our home, but as was said at the beginning, we have PERSEVERANCE.





