

During the orientation for LDC 1, students are given a list of expectations (found below). As the term suggests, we expect these items to be accomplished by each participant.

After the session is complete the LDC directors will meet and discuss how well each student did (or didn't) meet the expectations.

LDC 1 Expectations

- Must have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ and show evidence of growth in personal daily walk.
 - Memorize assigned scriptures and recite all the verses by the end of the week.
 - Prepare and present a personal testimony in a devotional format.
 - Read assigned chapters from assigned curriculum.
 - Be on time for activities and meetings.
 - Be a good example to the other younger campers.
 - Participate as a counselor for a day and cooperate fully with the counselor and other staff members.
 - Follow camper guidelines regarding cell phone use. No cell phone usage is allowed during LDC. In an emergency, your leader will provide a phone to use.
 - Participate in evening chapel with the younger campers.
 - Get to know 1 younger camper's spiritual history.
 - Develop a clear understanding of servant leadership.

LDC 1 Verses:

Please put these verses from the first section on 3x5 cards before you get to camp. Each one should have its own card and be written clearly. It is recommended to start memorizing and doing worksheets before you get to camp. The more you memorize and do before camp the less you will have to do at camp.

Memorize the following verses.

- John 3:16-17
- Romans 3:23
- Romans 5:8
- Romans 10:9-10
- Ephesians 2:8-10
- 2 Peter 1:3
- Psalm 119:9-11

Only do the work sheet for the following verses.

- Isaiah 26: 3-4
 - Joshua 1:7-9
 - Deuteronomy 10: 12-13
 - Philippians 2:3-5
 - Mark 10:43-45
 - 1 Peter 2: 1-3

Below are some Q&As regarding this process:

Q: Are all expectations created equal?

A: *Yes and no. There are two categories of expectations: Objective and Subjective. Objective include memorizing verses, PQT journal, book reading/discussion, etc. Subjective heavily involves attitude and maturity. We look at both. Either way, each expectation is there to build discipline, develop character, and/or give real experience in one of the roles on camp.*

Q: Are the students given feedback while they are in the program?

A: *YES! Half-way through the session, each student meets with their leader. During this meeting the leader will give an overall evaluation of the student and let them know what they need to work on in order to successfully complete LDC 1. Our whole goal is to “put the ball in the student’s court” and encourage them to reach up to the standard we’ve set.*

Q: What if a students has to leave for a medical reason?

A: *We handle this situation case-by-case. Depending on when during the session, we are usually able to make some concessions or work with the student.*

LDC 1 Application Timeline and Registration Process

PLEASE NOTE: Two references must be submitted for an application to be complete. Applications will be processed as they are completed.

November 5: LDC 1 applications can be submitted from this point forward.

December 31: Applications due for the initial draft of LDC 1 acceptance.

January 3: Initial draft of applicants will receive a notification of our decision regarding their application.

January 4 and later: Applicants will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis until all slots are full.

2 weeks before camp: Approved applicants will receive an email reminder with final packing details.
