Fall & Winter Projects
Tim spent a majority of this Fall building a second lane to an existing tube run (Timberslide). He cleared some trees, dug out stumps (thanks to Tim's brother Josh for his help!), and moved a lot of dirt to create the chute and berms. Twice as many campers will be able to slide down at a time, and it will lessen the wear and tear on the original tubing hill. Tim had high hopes of using it every weekend this winter but because of warm temperatures, winter activities were only able to be used for one

Despite not being able to offer any of our typical outdoor activities (skiing, skating, etc), the Program team was incredibly creative with what they planned for guests to do. Laser tag was a new addition to the program rotation thanks to some generous friends of camp! It was fun to see campers of all ages enjoying this new activity.





Spring & Summer

An early spring means an early maple syrup season! Uncle Jim arrived in the middle of February to assist Tim in adding 200 taps, sap lines, and buckets to the maple trees on camp property. They have a great friendship, and the staff like to visit with Uncle Jim and enjoy his famous "bean salad" (a giant jar of jelly beans).

Enrollment for summer camp opened up in January, and as of right now there are only a few spots left. Praise God for continued growth in camp's attendance! The summer theme is "More Than Gold" (based on 1 Peter 1:7) and is olympic themed.

In preparation for the summer (which begins June 10th), Tim is looking forward to re-arranging and updating all of the ranges: Archery, riflery, and tomahawk. This project will include changing locations, and creating new space for new targets and activities. These changes will create more space to allow safer operation of the ranges and allow more campers to enjoy these areas.


