A Patchy Winter

Dear friends and family, welcome to my Winter 23-24 update letter.

Although perhaps it should be called "Winter-ish;" as mild as the rest of the country's season was, Northern Wisconsin's was especially warm and dry. That tended to be a problem for things such as snow tubing and ice skating. It proved a pervasive and persistent challenge for planning and hosting.

While the activities we normally have on offer suffered this past Winter, we still had a full complement of guests each weekend. This was especially encouraging to me, as it continued to demonstrate how Lake Lundgren isn't in the business of just providing

activities and fun, but rather that they are only some of the tools at our disposal to serve God and people.

Weather that's kind to people is also typically kind to equipment, electronics especially so. The calm winter allowed me to perform some outdoor and large scale testing for an upcoming fiber optic installation. We also only had one minor power outage, and no internet service outages, making for very smooth operations (for once). Thank God for that!

I'm happy to say that the M365 migration I mentioned last letter has been completed, and that it has more or less disappeared into the background as a good tool should. Alongside the

software migration, I've been working to update our workstations from the collection of 12 to 14 year old machines we've had. About half of camp is now on newer, more power efficient hardware, which will save on wait times and power bills.

Continuing with adventures in many close roommates, we in the log cabin have now managed six months together without strangling each other. Quite the opposite, we've fostered a unique set of relationships with each other, and I've seen each of us respond to God's overtures at different times. I think perhaps that being a part of "the log cabin boys" has been the single most influential gift from God of my time at Lake Lundgren Bible Camp.

Getting the Next Steps Ready

Josh Grandaw - our food service director — and his wife Natalie expect their first child to arrive soon this Spring. Both Josh and I are glad that some time ago we chose to prepare someone to run the kitchen in case of his absence — that person being me! While Josh and Natalie prepare for their child we will also see how well we've prepared to cover for temporary absences of Josh, and will learn how best to both keep the kitchen running and to allow Josh the time he and his growing family the time they will need together.

Adjacent to running the kitchen, we expect to grow the kitchen team a little more this Summer. One of our SSTers, Hannah Cunningham, has asked to spend the whole Summer in the kitchen in preparation for her internship here beginning in August. It is exciting to have another staff member interested in taking on the challenges of camp's kitchen and to provide yet more depth to our "roster."

As always, the documentation of camp's IT systems and the knowledge key to maintaining them continues. I was working on this project, and it struck me how much there is to communicate; I've done much more than it feels like to me. I also reflected that it has been 2 1/2 years since I started here, and it will be 3 years by the end of this Summer. That's so much time that I didn't expect to have here!

This Winter I felt the need to decide on joining LLBC's permanent staff team; for my time here I've been committed only a year at a time. All that said, there are yet fiber optics to install, IT volunteers to coordinate, a Summer to cook for, Hannah to train, and all of it to pass on such that our progress is maintained. I aim to test for certifications and put together my portfolio before Summer, and will begin searching for an IT job or internship I can begin in October or later. I thank you all so, so much for supporting me in serving God and people by enabling and easing the work of others at LLBC! I pray I will follow God to finish my work here well, and that you will continue with me until its end.
